### Executive Director's Report

Hello to all the property owners in Tink Wig. The summer is over and autumn is upon us. It was a successful time; the weather was good and the pool was very active.

#### Recent Highlights:

- The board approved refurbishing our pool in the spring. We hired Custom Pools by DeRichie. They are scheduled to start in early April and hopefully we can open it by Memorial Day and on weekends till the pool attendants get out of school. We have the cash in our reserve account to pay for this in its entirety. The cost will be approximately \$250,000.
- The bridge failed the October inspection and requires the bridge to be closed on Nov 5th until further notice. The bridge needs replacement (a repair is more costly). We applied for a grant from Monroe County.
- We are going to apply for a loan for the bridge replacement. The
  amount of the loan is dependent on the grant money we may receive.
   We will be notified in late winter if we will be awarded any money.
   Included in the loan, we plan on adding the cost for renovating the
  bathrooms in the clubhouse. We are waiting on estimates at this time.
   A special meeting will be scheduled in the spring for membership
  approval of the loan. Be sure to vote on this important loan
  authorization or come to the meeting in person and cast your ballot.
- Few reminders: Dogs are not permitted in the common areas. Please leash and clean up after your pet. Also, garbage cans should be pulled back from the roads by the following day after pick-up.
- There will be no indoor social functions for a while due to covid-19. We are following CDC recommendations.

I am hoping for a dry winter with very little snow. Enjoy your autumn/ winter season.

## Lake Report

This has been a great year for the lake. Mother Nature was very kind. Yes, we did have some hot periods and plenty of rain but not enough to upset the water quality. As a result, the blue green algae that plagued our lake last year was not present. Plant growth was under control and the water quality was good. Also, the bacterial preventative treatment applied by Aqua Link was a contributing factor to help control the reoccurrence of an algae bloom.

I am waiting for our lake management contract for 2022. Once I receive it, I will hold a lake committee meeting for review and then present it to the board of directors for approval.

This year the board recommended a voluntary catch and release program to all our property owners who fish the lake. Sunfish and bluegills are exempt from this program. Please practice good fishing etiquette. I am going to present to the board a recommendation to stock largemouth bass in the lake as recommended by Aqua Link sometime next year.

Another recommendation to the board for their approval will be a replacement of the floating dock by the boat launch area. I believe it has served its purpose

## Not just the Junk File



"It is a good habit to look in both the junk and the deleted files once a week to see if there is anything going there automatically that you really need"

Many of you are aware that emails from some senders or with specific content go automatically to the junk file on your email account. There are also times depending on the type of email you use when emails will automatically go to the Deleted file or Trash file. I personally have had this happen with emails sent from Tink Wig HOA. I cannot tell you what email types (gmail, Hotmail, etc.) do this. For me it was Hotmail. It is a good habit to look in both the junk and the deleted files once a week to see if there is anything going there automatically that you really need. Even if you can't do it that often, try to do it periodically. For each email system there are generally settings or processes that you can use to force these emails to go to your inbox. Google searches provide good information as to how to manage these email situations.

We will also investigate to see if there can be a different mechanism to send the Tink Wig HOA emails to minimize the times they would go to junk or auto delete.
